

WELCOME TO CABBAGETOWN

The name "Cabbagetown" dates back to the late 1840s, when Irish immigrants who moved to the neighbourhood were said to have been so poor, that they grew cabbage in their front yards. In 2004, Cabbagetown became a Heritage Conservation District within the City of Toronto.

When you visit Cabbagetown, don't miss the Victorian houses and cozy lanes. The residential area, north of Gerrard St. and extending to Wellesley St., and from the Don River to Ontario St., has been recognized as the largest area of continuous and intact Victorian housing in North America. It has been studied by academics, explored by tourists, and is much enjoyed by its residents.

Parliament St., the commercial heart of Cabbagetown, boasts 24 properties listed under the city's Inventory of Heritage Properties. It offers a diverse range of businesses, ranging from interior decorations and furnishings, pet care, family restaurants and international cuisine, health food stores, delis, bakeries, and much more. The Cabbagetown Festival of the Arts is one of the longest running festivals in the city, and is headed by the Cabbagetown Business Improvement Area. Every year, the festival opens its doors to thousands of visitors from around the city, with local artists, not-for-profits, and vendors working together to promote their local businesses.

Recommendation: Start at Parliament and Winchester (or Carlton) and walk east, picking directions at random. For a smart phone primer on the architectural styles as you walk go to cabbagetownpa.ca/style and hit the titles on the left of the page.

There are several tour themes, such as the Architecture and History tours, Cabbagetown's Medical Past tour, and the Artists and Writer's tours, each with a different route, which can vary according to the guide.

Cabbagetown People, a part of the CPA, has placed 35 plaques through the area, including Regent Park. They celebrate the lives of notable people who have lived here.
